Job duties:

- Approach parents and children introducing yourself and sharing information about the program.
- Commit one hour weekly on a regular recurring schedule to read in the Youth Services Department.
- Read a variety of children's books with clarity and enthusiasm based the age and development of the child.
- Read to children one-on-one and/or in small groups.
- Develop and apply innovative and appropriate reading techniques that create interest, understanding and enthusiasm amongst children.
- Maintain and record number of program participants.
- Maintain regular reading schedule of one hour weekly.
- We may ask you to attend a regularly scheduled staff reading before beginning to read.

Requirements:

- You must love to read.
- Enjoy young, energetic children with wide ranging attention spans.
- Be on time and committed to the program; this is a publicized public program, so it is imperative you are on time and committed to the program.
- Be able to positively redirect unpleasant behavior in a gentle, nonjudgmental way.
- Be able to read favorite books over, and over, and over again.
- Must be free of all communicable diseases

Level of Commitment: Reader is In Volunteers are expected to maintain a regular, weekly schedule for at least three months. **Volunteers are expected to give the Volunteer Coordinator as much notice as possible if they are unable to fulfill their obligation.**

Impact of your Volunteer Services as a Reader in the Reader-is-In Program

In 2014, volunteers in the Reader- is-in program read to 519 children promoting early literacy and making it easier for parents to check out library materials.
