

Results Features

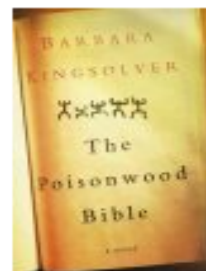
Results can be narrowed by checking on one of the **subject hyperlinks** in the narrow-results-by-subject column. A new Results List will be displayed with a new list of subject hyperlinks.

Click on **Check the Library Catalog for this Book Title** to access the record in the FLLS catalog if it exists.

Personal Folders

Create a **Folder** to retain search results, histories of searches, and establish alerts when new results that fit a saved search are added to the database.

Click on **Find Similar Books** to select Required and/or Desired Subject Headings related to a book title.

[What is *NovelList*?](#)

NovelList is an [online readers' advisory resource](#) to help you assist your patrons to find the books they want to read. The database can be searched to find more books by a [particular author](#), books in a [specific genre](#), or [similar books](#) to those they have read.

In addition, *NovelList* includes: [Award](#) lists covering a range of genres, subject areas and reading levels.

[Grab and Go Book](#) lists arranged by genre or topic for a range of reading levels.

[Author Read-a-likes](#) list the genres in which the author writes, representative titles with plot descriptions, and a listing of similar authors.

[Book Discussion Guides](#) for the discussion leader include a brief author biography, summary of the book, questions and answers to stimulate discussion and other reading suggestions.

[Book Talks](#) on children's and young adult titles to promote reading.

[Feature Articles](#) present a subgenre or topic with notes about titles to help with creating displays and reading lists, and gain familiarity with new books.

Search Options

Basic Search

Enter author name, book title, and/or descriptive keywords that might describe a plot to search all the designated MARC fields as well as the content in Book Discussion guides, Book Talks, etc. Searches can be limited to reading levels.

Advanced Search

Use the dropdown menus and the Boolean operators (and/or/not) to search one or more indexes simultaneously. To narrow the search, use [limiters](#), such as reading level and author characteristics. To broaden the search, select one or more [expanders](#) to include synonyms and plurals of search terms and search full-text.


Searching Series
