ROMULUS.

ROMULUS, an original town, was formed March 5, 1794, as part of Onondaga County, Fayette, (then extending north to Lake Ontario,) was taken off in 1800. Romulus on the line of Varick, and partly in that town, is a station on the Lehigh Valley Railway, and is the principal village. Hayt's Corners, second in size, is at the junction of the Lehigh Valley with the H. C., O. and W. Railroad. Kendaia is a station on the western branch of the Lehigh.

SENECA FALLS.

(TOWN OUTSIDE THE VILLAGE.)

SENECA FALLS was formed from Junius March 26, 1829. The surface is nearly level and lies 30 to 50 feet above the surface of Cayuga Lake. The town is crossed by the New York Central Railroad and the Seneca Canal. A private rail-

road connects Seneca Falls village with the lake at Cayuga Lake Park. Orchard Beach on the lake is a pretty summer resort and is reached by a line of stages from Seneca Falls and by ferry from Cayuga.

SENECA FALLS VILLAGE.

SENECA FALLS VILLAGE is on the site of the first settlement in the County. Job Smith, from Ulster County, in 1787 located on the Flats just below the subsequent site of Col. Mynderse's upper red mill. For many years after Col. Wilhelmus Mynderse's settlement, as agent and one of the proprietors, the village grew slowly, but it has since become one of the most important manufacturing villages of its size in the country, and in a single line, it is said, leads the world.
