WILLARD.

WILLARD, partly in Ovid and partly in Romulus, is located mostly upon State lands. The village is a port on Seneca Lake, the terminus of the H. C., O. & W. railroad, and a station on the Lehigh Valley R. R.

The Willard State Hospital, located here for the treatment and care of insane people, now in its 26th year, has grown to be a great charity, and the condition of the unfortunate people living here has been wonderfully ameliorated, and many have been restored to their friends, cured. The number of patients in hospital June 30, 1894, was 2,153, and they were waited upon and cared for by about 400 people—officers and attendants.

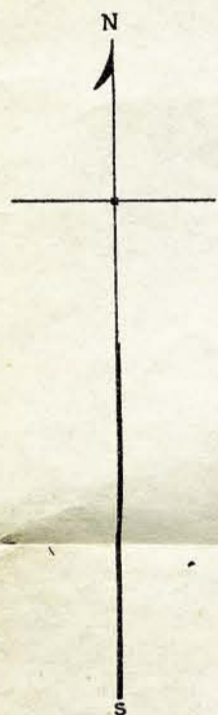
