# CITY OF ITHACA.

## CITY WARDS.

**1st Ward.**—All that part of said city lying on the westerly side of the middle of Corn, Varick and Fifth streets.

**2nd Ward.**—All that part of said city bounded as follows : Beginning on the south boundary of said city in the center of Corn street ; running thence north along the center of said Corn street to its intersection with State street ; thence east along the center of said State street to its intersection with Tioga street ; thence north along the center of said Tioga street to its intersection with Buffalo street ; thence east along the center of said Buffalo street to the east boundary line of said city ; thence south along the east boundary of said city to the south boundary line of said city ; thence west along the south boundary of said city to the place of beginning.

**3rd Ward.**—All that part of said city lying on the east of the center of Corn street, center of Varick street, center of Fifth street and north of the center of State street, and west of the center of Tioga street.

**4th Ward.**—All that part of said city lying east of the center of Tioga street and north of the center of Buffalo street.

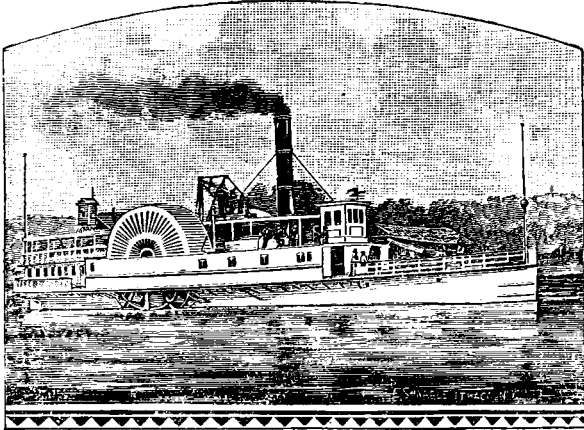
