SIGNAL SERVICE WEATHER SIGNS.

INDICATIONS.—No. 1, White Flag—Clear or Fair Weather. No. 2, Blue Flag—Rain or Snow. No. 3, White Flag, Black Center—Cold Wave. No. 4, Black Triangular Flag—Temperature. No. 5, Blue and White Flag—Showers. No. 4, when placed above or before Nos. 1 and 2, indicates warmer weather; when placed below or after, colder.

Explanation of Whistle Signals.

The warning signal, to attract attention, will be a long blast of from fifteen to twenty seconds duration. After this warning signal has been sounded, long blasts (of from four to six seconds duration) refer to weather, and short blasts (of from one to three seconds duration) refer to temperature; those for weather to be sounded first.

BLASTS.	INDICATE.
One long.....	Fair weather.
Two long alone..	Rain or snow, stationary temperature.
Two long.....	Rain or snow.
Three long.....	Local rains.
One short.....	Lower temperature.
Two short.....	Higher temperature.
Three short.....	Cold Wave.

INTERPRETATION OF COMBINATION BLASTS.

One long, alone—Fair weather, stationary temperature.
 One long and one short—Fair weather, lower temperature.
 Two long and two short—Rain or snow, higher temperature.
 One long and three short—Fair weather, cold wave.
 Three long and two short—local rains, higher temperature.

CITY WARDS.

1st Ward.—All that part of said city lying on the westerly side of the middle of Corn, Varick and Fifth streets.

2d Ward.—All that part of said city bounded as follows : Beginning on the south boundary of said city in the center of Corn street ; running thence north along the center of said Corn street to its intersection with State street ; thence east along the center of said State Street to its intersection with Tioga street ; thence north along the center of said Tioga street to its intersection with Buffalo street ; thence east along center of said Buffalo street to the east boundary line of said city ; thence south along the east boundary of said city to the south boundary line of said city ; thence west along the south boundary of said city to the place of beginning.

3d Ward.—All that part of said city lying on the east of the center of Corn street, center of Varick street, center of Fifth street and north of the center of State street, and west of the center of Tioga street.

4th Ward.—All that part of said city lying east of the center of Tioga street and north of the center of Buffalo street.

STREET DIRECTORY.

Giving the name and location of each street, and showing what other streets run from it or across it, with the number at which they intersect. From this list the location of any number on a street can be easily ascertained; for instance, wishing to know on what part of E State street No. 68 is, you find that Tioga street intersects State at No. 62 and Aurora at No. 88, showing that 68 is between Tioga and Aurora. A cypher (0) indicates there is no number; a dash (—) no street intersects on that side. The words North, South, East, West, at head of columns indicates the side of the street.

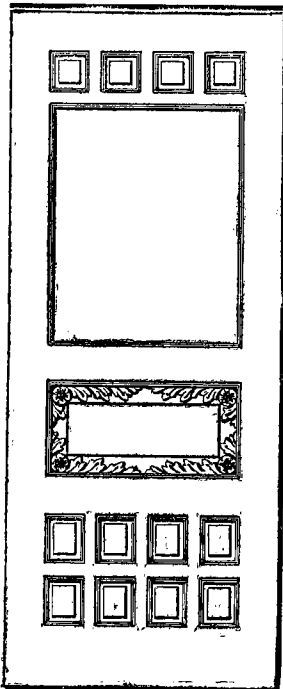

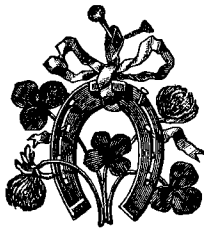
