ELECTION DISTRICTS

First Ward, First District

Beginning at the intersection of the south city line and the Cayuga inlet running thence northerly in the center of Cayuga inlet to a point intersecting the west boundary line of the third district of the Fifth ward, thence northerly along said boundary line to the north line of the city as established in 1921, thence westerly along the north city line to the Lehigh Valley right-of-way, thence southerly along said right-of-way to the old city line, thence westerly to the west city line, thence southerly to the south city line, thence easterly to the place of beginning.

Registration and voting place, Lehigh Valley House, No. 810 W. Buffalo street.

First Ward, Second District

Beginning at the intersection of the south city line and the Cayuga inlet, running thence northerly along the Cayuga inlet to State street, in State street to Corn street, in Corn extended to the south city line, thence westerly to the place of beginning.

First Ward, Third District

Third Ward, Third District

Fourth Ward, First District

PARKS, POINTS OF INTEREST, ETC.

Buttermilk Creek—Two miles south of the city. Entrances may be had at the head via South Aurora street and by a cross road, or from the entrance proper at the foot, out five mile drive in the valley. This gorge is remarkably picturesque, especially noted being Pinnacle Rock, the Narrow Gorge and the Long Cascade, 199 feet high.

Cascadilla Creek—A gorge at the lower end of Cornell University Campus. Views may be had from the bridges and from Goodwin and Smith walk.

Cayuga Lake—Is one of the largest of the Finger Lakes forty miles long and three miles wide. Has shores of rolling hills and steep cliffs. Fed by cold springs and is over 400 feet deep in many places.

Cornell University—East hill. Beautifully situated on high ground overlooking the city and Cayuga Lake.

Coy's Glen—Two miles south of the city. Three miles in length. Each turn of the stream opens new vistas of beauty. Falls, cascades, rapids, shallows, odd rock formations, etc.

DeWitt Park—Cayuga, Buffalo and Mill streets.

Enfield Gorge—Seven miles south of the city. One of the wildest and most picturesque in this vicinity. Can be explored in two ways. Easiest is by conveyance to Enfield Falls village and thence down the gorge to the foot of Lucifer Falls, 240 feet high, a walk of about a mile. This path leads through the narrow gorge, the "Devil's Kitchen," and the "Flume." Another entrance is from the state road in the valley.

Fair Grounds—Intersection Titus avenue at Clinton and Meadow streets.

Fall Creek Gorge—North of Cornell University Campus. Unusual and beautiful Triphammer Falls East Avenue bridge crosses just below the Falls. Foot of the Falls may be reached through the stairways of Hydraulic Laboratory building of Cornell University. Stewart Avenue bridge crosses at the opening of the gorge. Ithaca Falls is 156 feet high and is the most interesting within the city limits. A tunnel near Ithaca Falls was drilled through solid rock for 300 feet.

Finger Lake Region—Geologists claim there are only four other sections in the world with same formation and natural beauty as the Finger Lakes of central New York—these are located in Scotland, England, Switzerland and Patagonia. Seneca Lake is the largest and deepest with a length of 38 miles and depth of 600 feet. Cayuga Lake is second with a length of 40 miles and depth of

400 feet. Keuka Lake is the wildest of the group, the hills surrounding it drop into its depth not even pausing to form a beach line. Owasco is the lake farthest to the east and is popular for yachting and camps and cottages are numerous on its shores. Canandaigua Lake is the smallest with length of 15 miles. Variety is the keynote of the region and the topography most unusual. It is a land of wonderful fertility and prosperous farmers, hill locked lakes, gloomy gorges, waterfalls and wild ravines, and sylvan dells. To the lover of nature an enchanted country and a wonderland of surprises and grandeur. Railroads and very fine highways cross and recross this section making all parts of it accessible to tourists. For camping, boating, fishing and for seekers in the labyrinths of nature it is the great coming vacation ground of the eastern United States. For further information and illustrated literature write Ithaca Board of Commerce.

Glen Springs—Five minutes' walk from Watkins Glen. Famous mineral springs. Three hundred feet above Seneca Lake. Valuable for drinking and bathing.

Ithaca Gorge—Entrance at Fall Creek from Lake street.

Lick Brook—Six miles south of Ithaca on the east side of the valley. Somewhat difficult of access. Contains at least two falls, the sight of which is worth all the trouble it costs. The lower is the "Veiled" Falls 60 feet high; "The Cathedral" Falls where the stream drops more than 150 feet into an immense round amphitheatre.

Point Lookout—On Cornell Heights. Take "loop ride" trolley car. A wonderful view of Lake Cayuga and valley.

Stewart Park—Stewart Park formerly Renwick Park, is Ithaca's most popular playground. It is named for the late Mayor Stewart whose efforts and financial support made the Park and its activities possible. Located at the head of Lake Cayuga it is an ideal spot. A large bathing

beach, picnic ground and athletic field are maintained for the amusement of the thousands of pleasure seekers who visit the Park yearly.

Taughannock Falls and Gorge—

Ten miles north of Ithaca on west shore Lake Cayuga. Can be reached by boat on Lake Cayuga, Lehigh Valley Railroad, or by a drive along the beautiful winding shore road. The gorge is several miles long and aside from the smaller falls in the upper gorge it contains the famous Bridal Veil or Taughannock Falls

220 feet high, the highest straight fall east of the Rockies, not excepting Niagara.

Washington Park—At Washington, Buffalo, Park place and Mill street.

Watkins Glen—This is the most wonderful of the many Gorges and Glens in this vicinity. Twenty-five miles southwest of Ithaca at the end of Seneca Lake. One of the natural wonders of the world. Reached by state road or by train to Elmira and thence by trolley. Is now a state park.

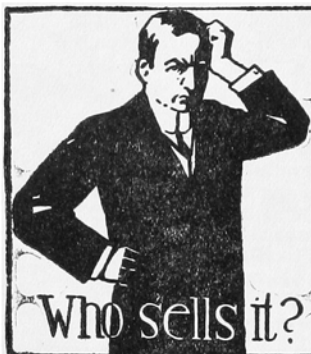
